What to bring the <u>NIGHT</u> of:

- Social Security Number & Driver's License Number
- Alien Registration Number (if not U.S. citizen)
- 2018 Federal Tax information & 2018 W-2's
- 2018-amount of child support received
- 2018-interest income (1099 statement)
- 2018-veterans non-education benefits

For both student & legal parent(s)

- Investments (stocks, bonds, & real estate, but not including home which you live in)-value as of today
- Cash, savings, checking-value as of today
- FSA ID for parent if previously filed FAFSA for an older child who attended college

FAOS

What is the cost to complete the FAFSA? It's FREE!

Not sure which college yet? No problem! Up to 10 schools can be listed on the FAFSA. If needed, additional schools can be added at a later time.

Who is considered the "legal parent"? Biological, adoptive, or parent determined by the state. Grandparents, foster parents, legal guardians, widowed stepparents, aunts & uncles, are not considered parents unless they have <u>legally adopted</u> the student.
